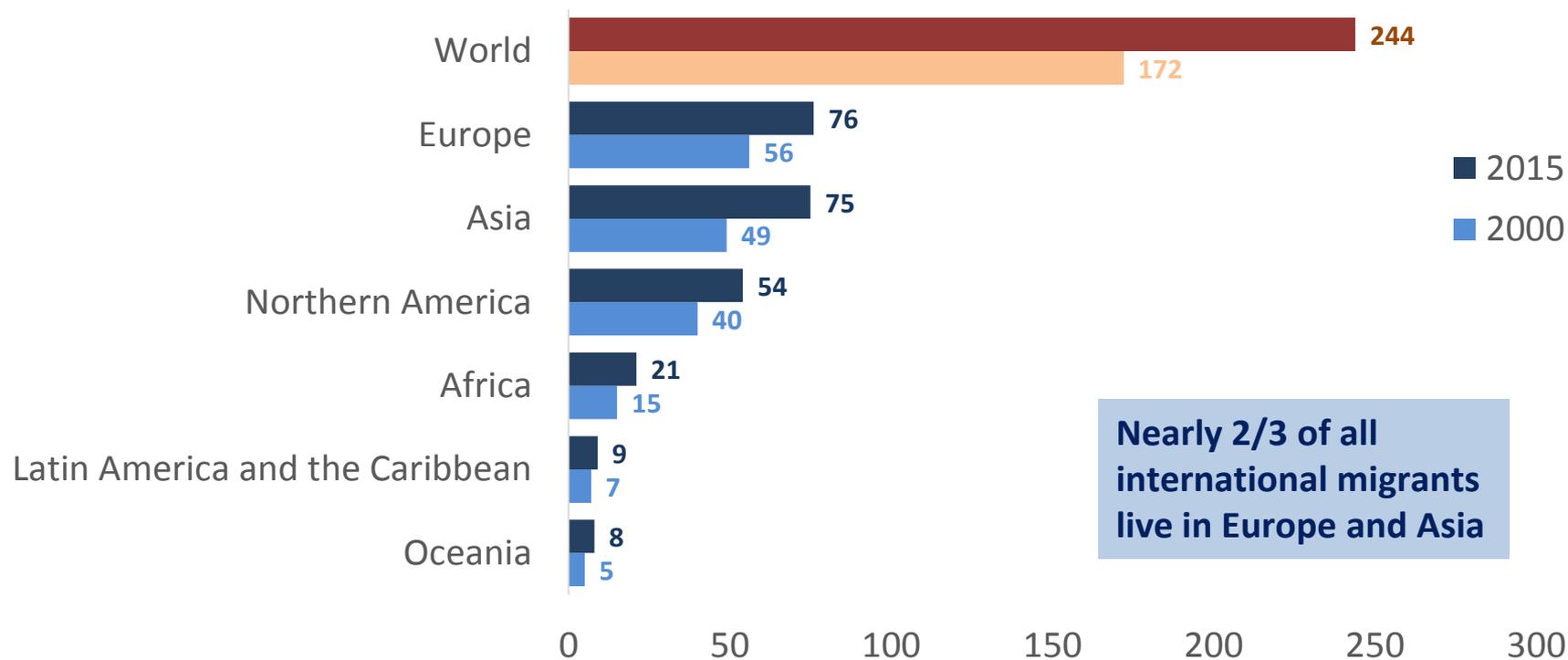


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Number of international migrants by region of destination, 2000 and 2015

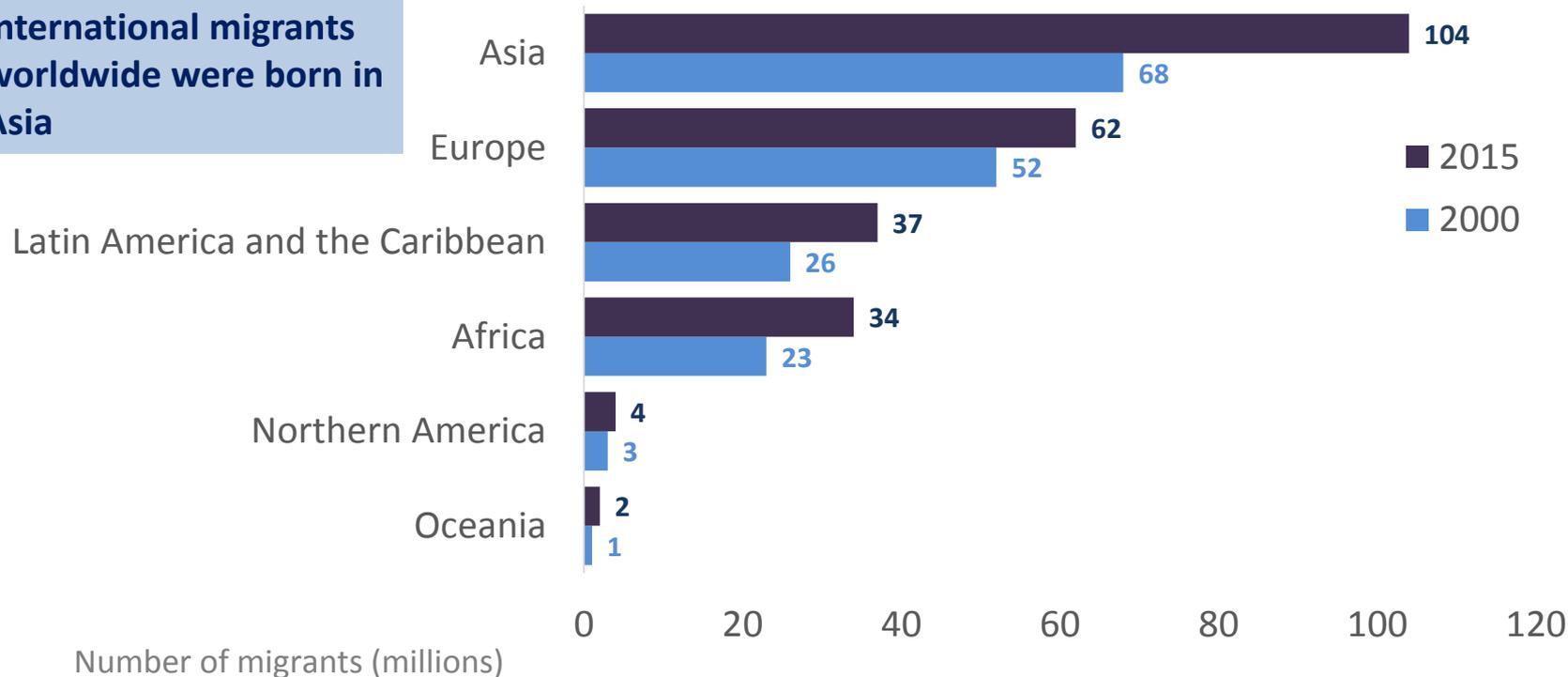
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Number of international migrants by region of origin, 2000 and 2015

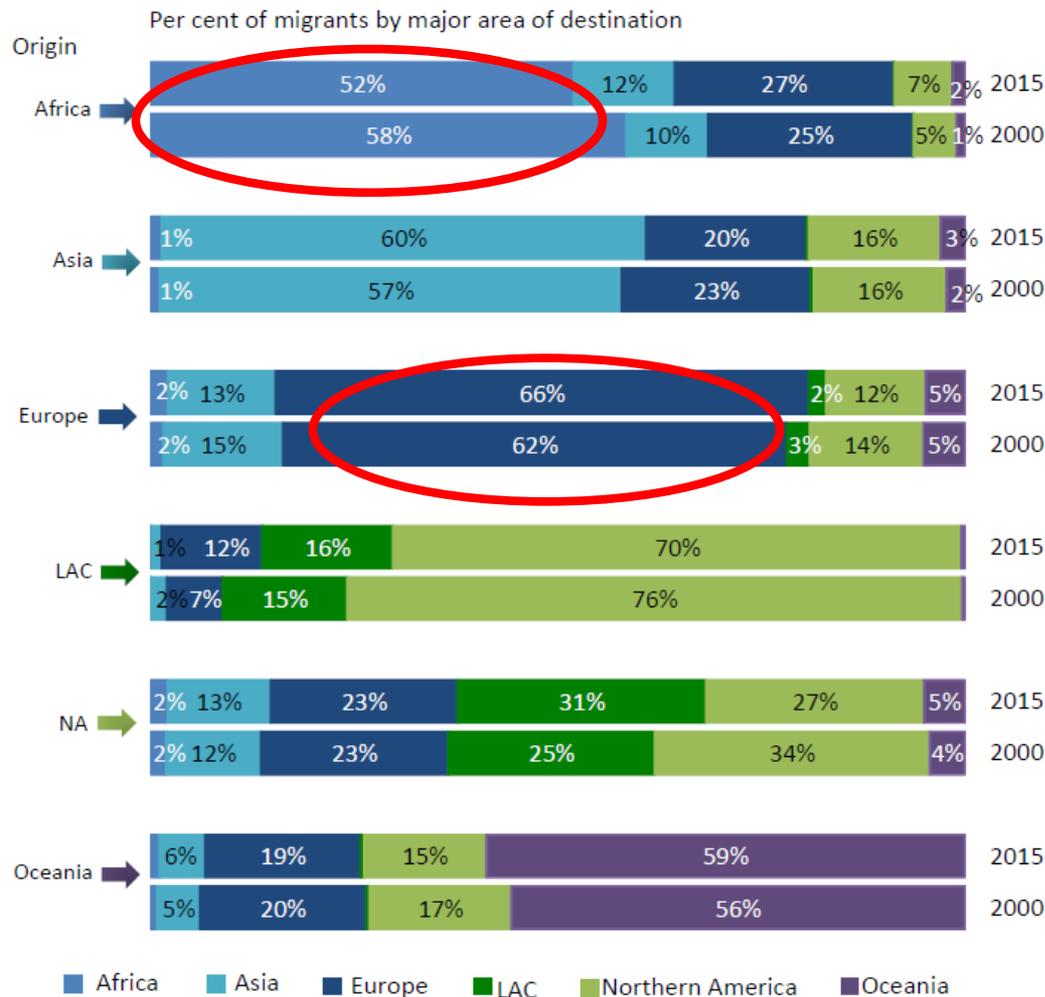


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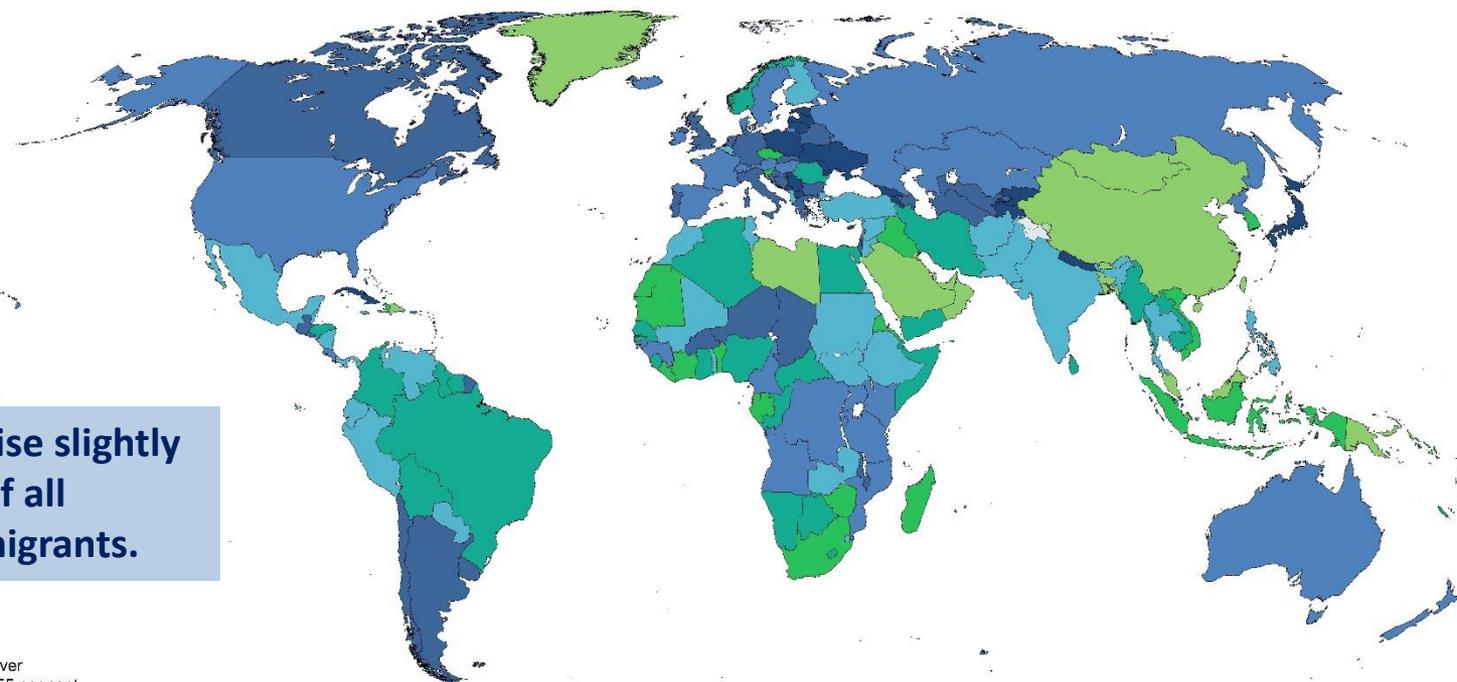


In many parts of the World, migration occurs primarily within major areas

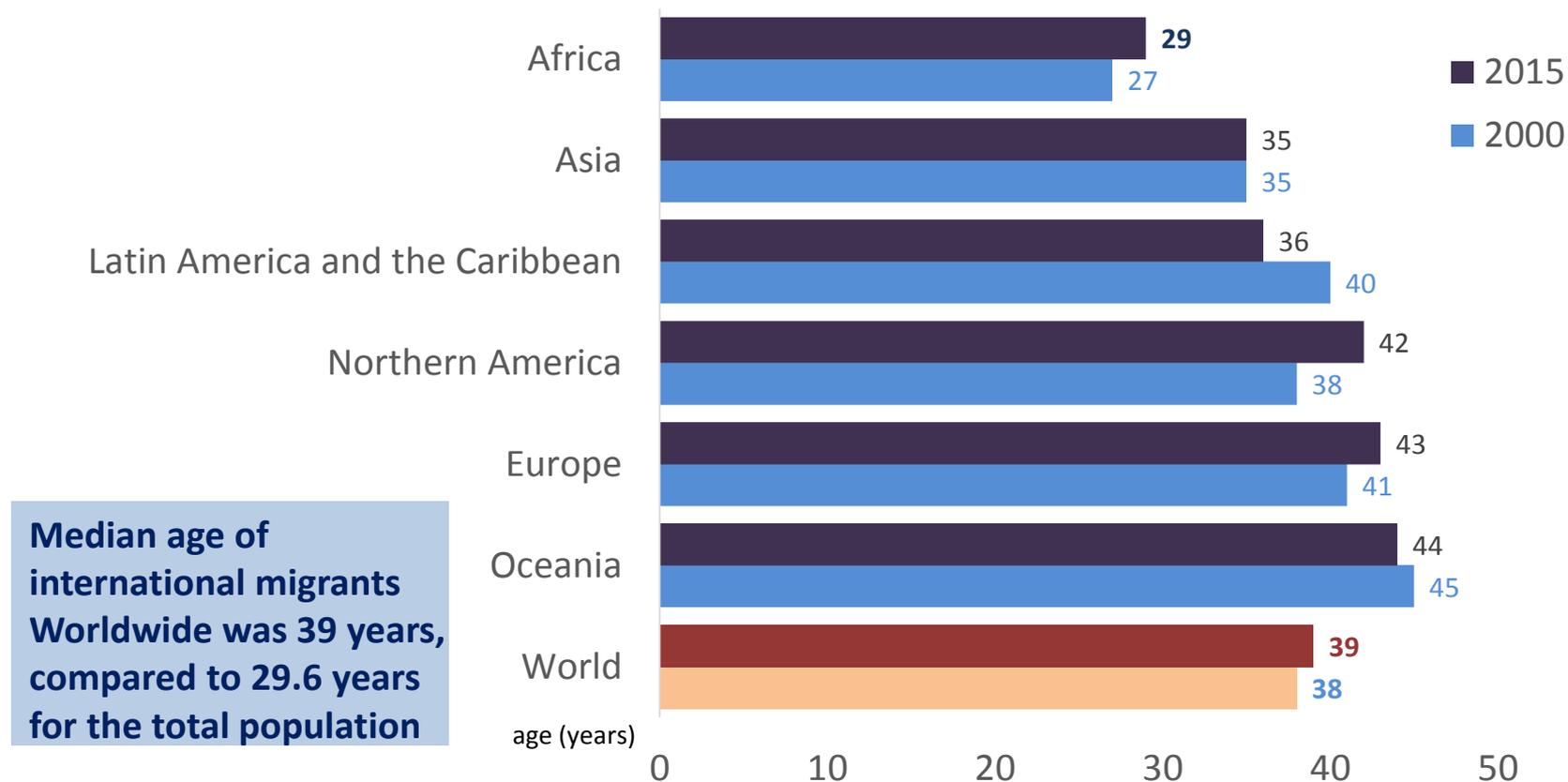


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Median age among international migrants and by region of destination, 2000 and 2015

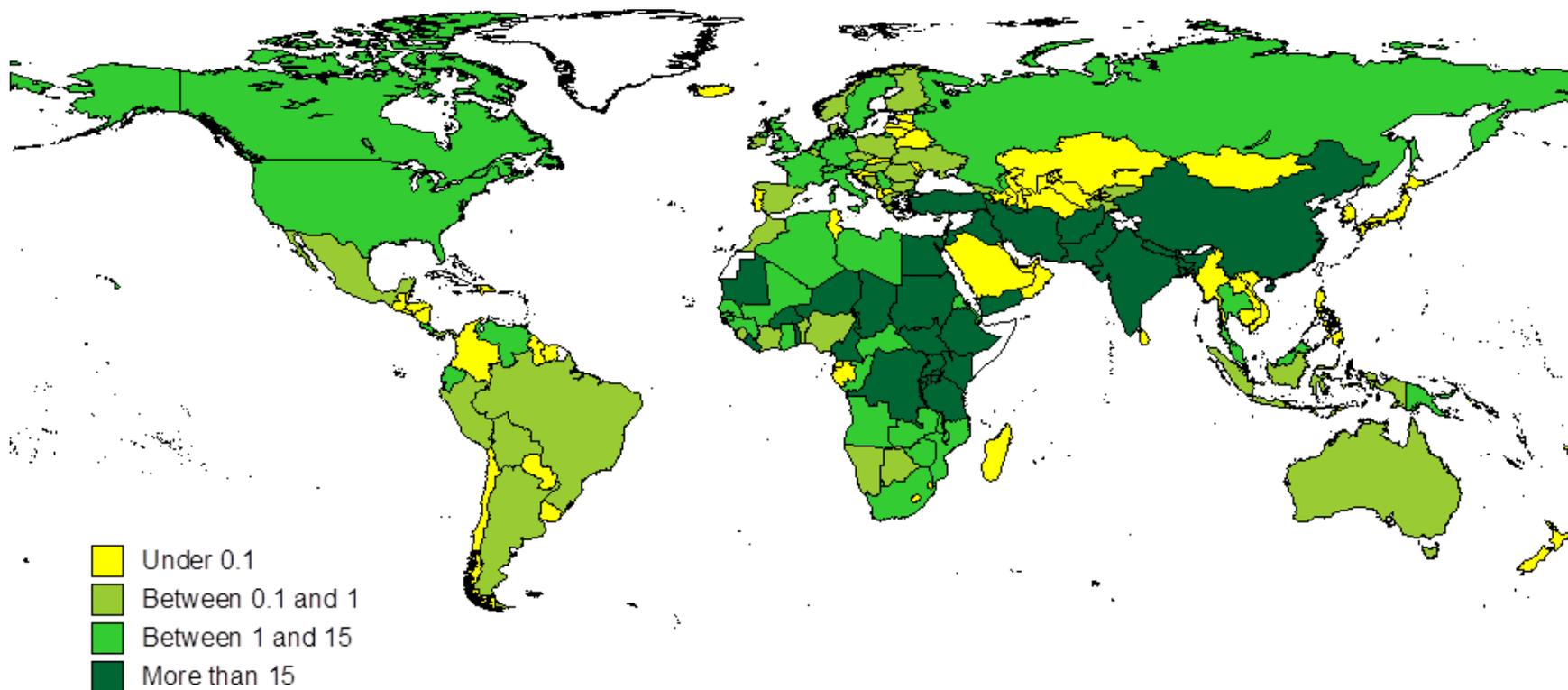
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Responsibility sharing for refugees

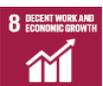

- Mitigate negative consequences of anti-money laundering and counter-terrorism financing measures

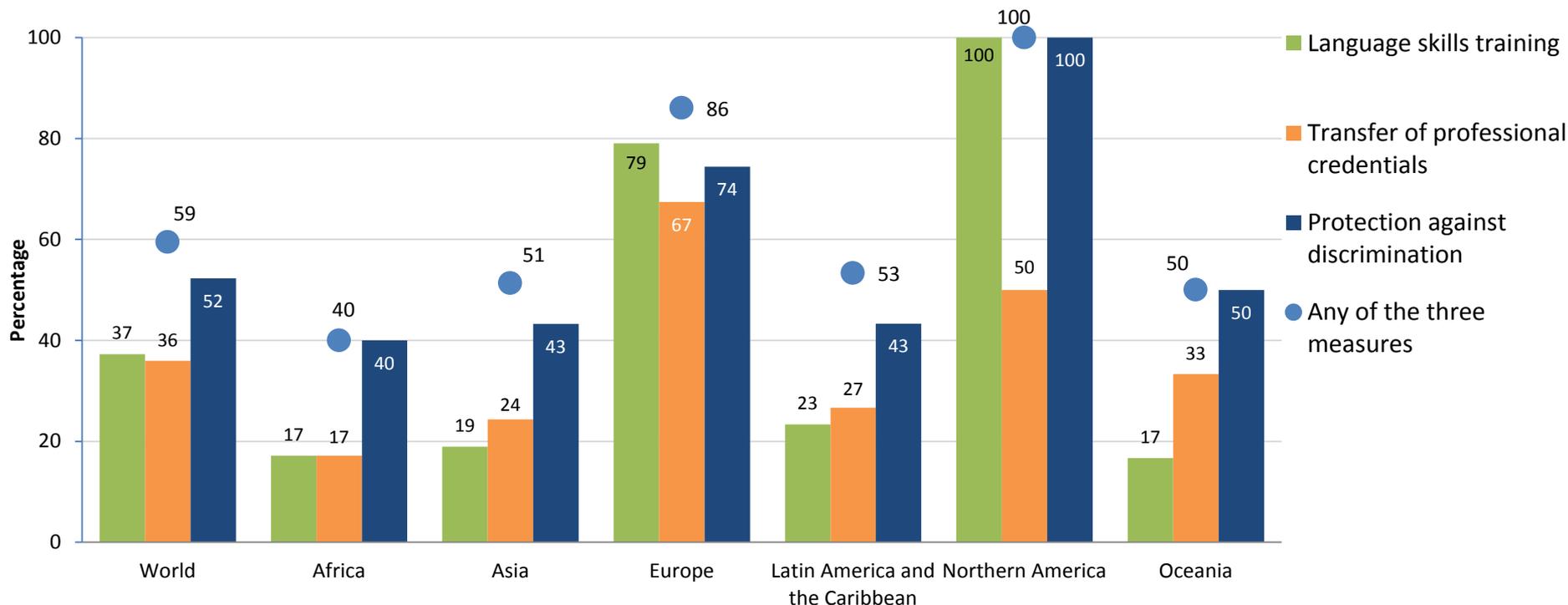
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More than half of all countries have a policy to promote the integration of migrants

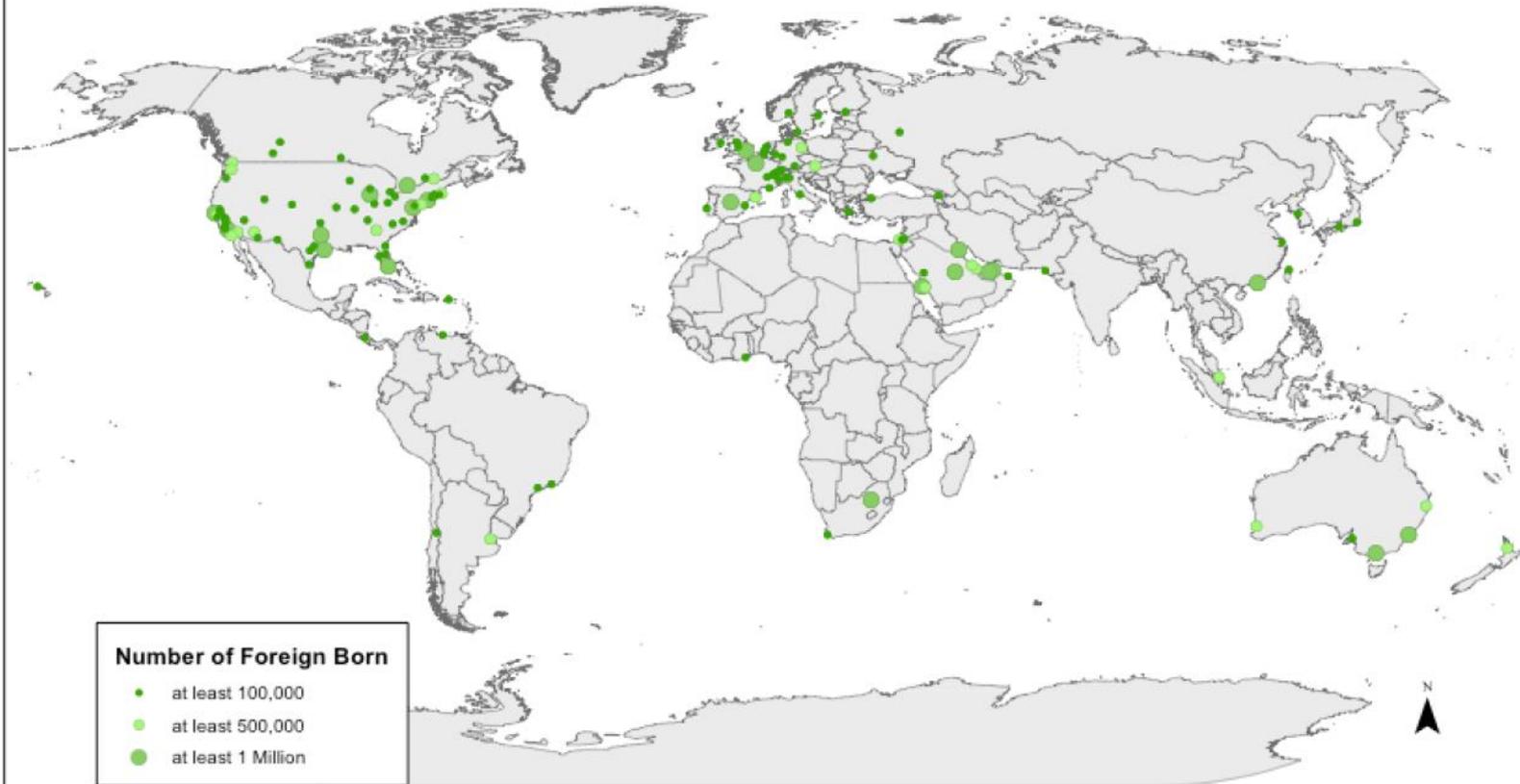


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Cities with at least 100,000 Foreign Born, 2010-2016

Lack of **common definitions** and variety of **institutions** engaged in regulating cross-border movement and servicing migrants



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Challenges to coherence and effective collaboration among different levels of governments



National versus **local** authority and responsibility



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Availability of reliable, timely, comparable and spatially disaggregated **data** for foreign-born in urban areas (regular ↔ irregular; informal settlements)



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Privacy concerns when analyzing spatially disaggregated data for foreign-born/native-born



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Character of UN resolutions and decisions and **issues related to monitoring and follow-up** – policy is made in national capitals



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Modalities of interaction and cooperation across and within levels of governments for improved service delivery for migrants



Strengthen **policy coordination** mechanisms

Involve different **stakeholders**



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Improve **capacity development** at different levels of governments



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Improve **capacity development** at different levels of governments



Build **awareness** and **knowledge**



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Mainstream migration into national and local development strategies and plans -> implement multicultural planning
