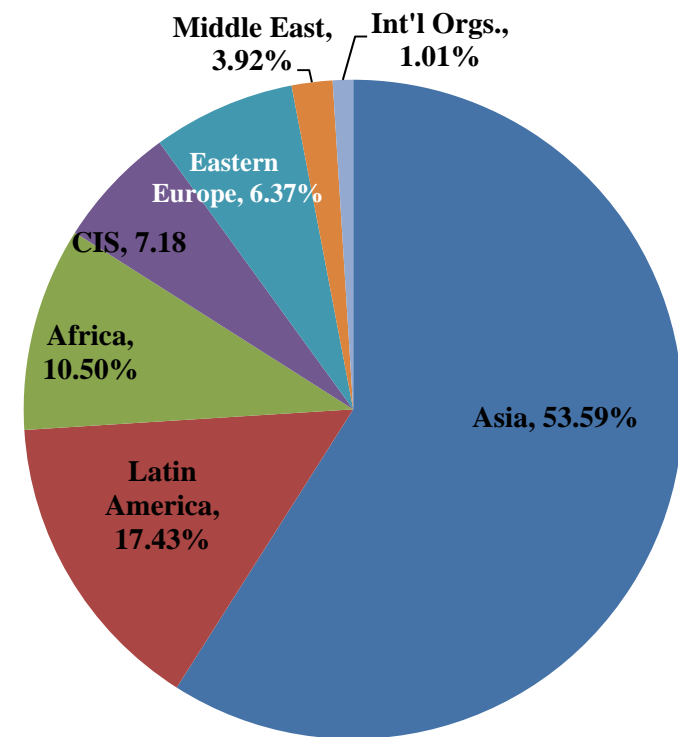
05 Korea IT Learning Program (KoIL)
