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1. Main points

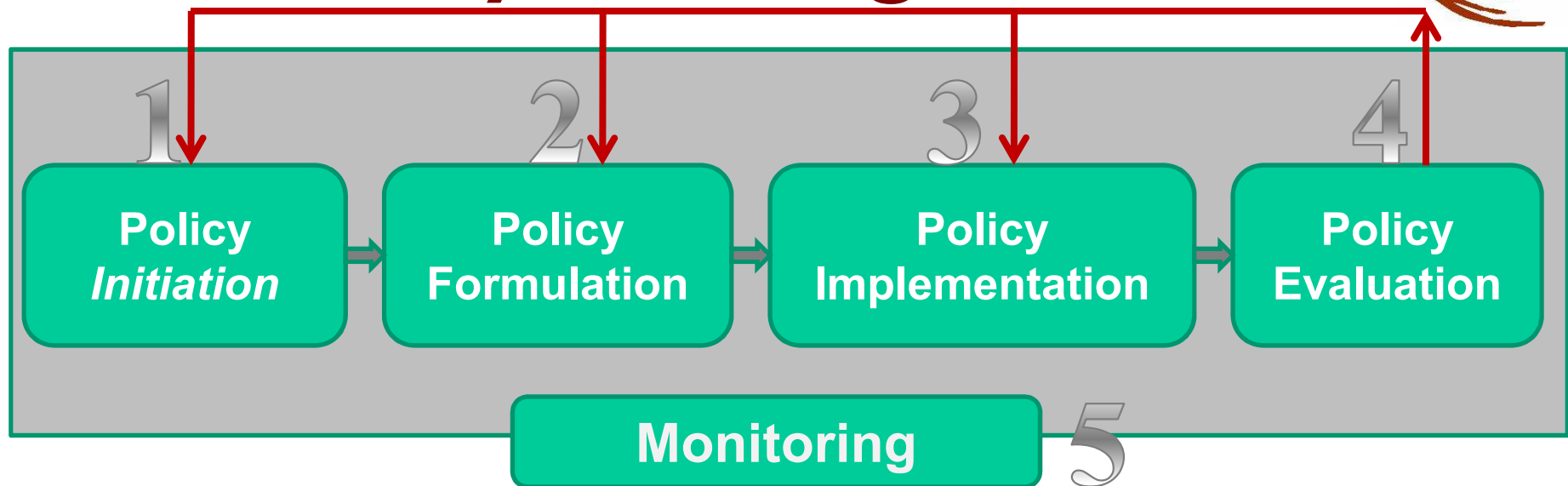
1. SDG Implementation requires **mechanisms** of coordination (government) and consultation (business + civil society)
2. Consultation and coordination are possible if the implementing administration is **effective** and **efficient**
3. Capacity building (training) must be of dual nature (individual learning **and** institutional application/transfer of knowledge to the job site)

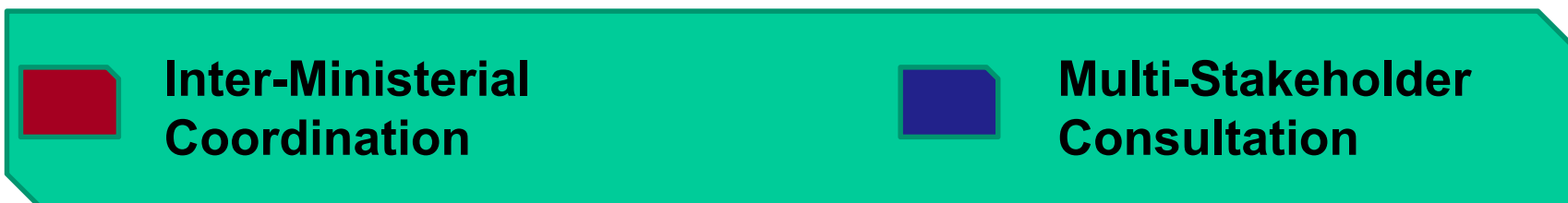


- **SDG 16.6:**

Ensure **responsive, inclusive, participatory and representative decision-making** at all levels

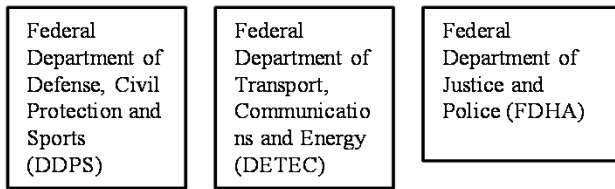
Policy Making Process



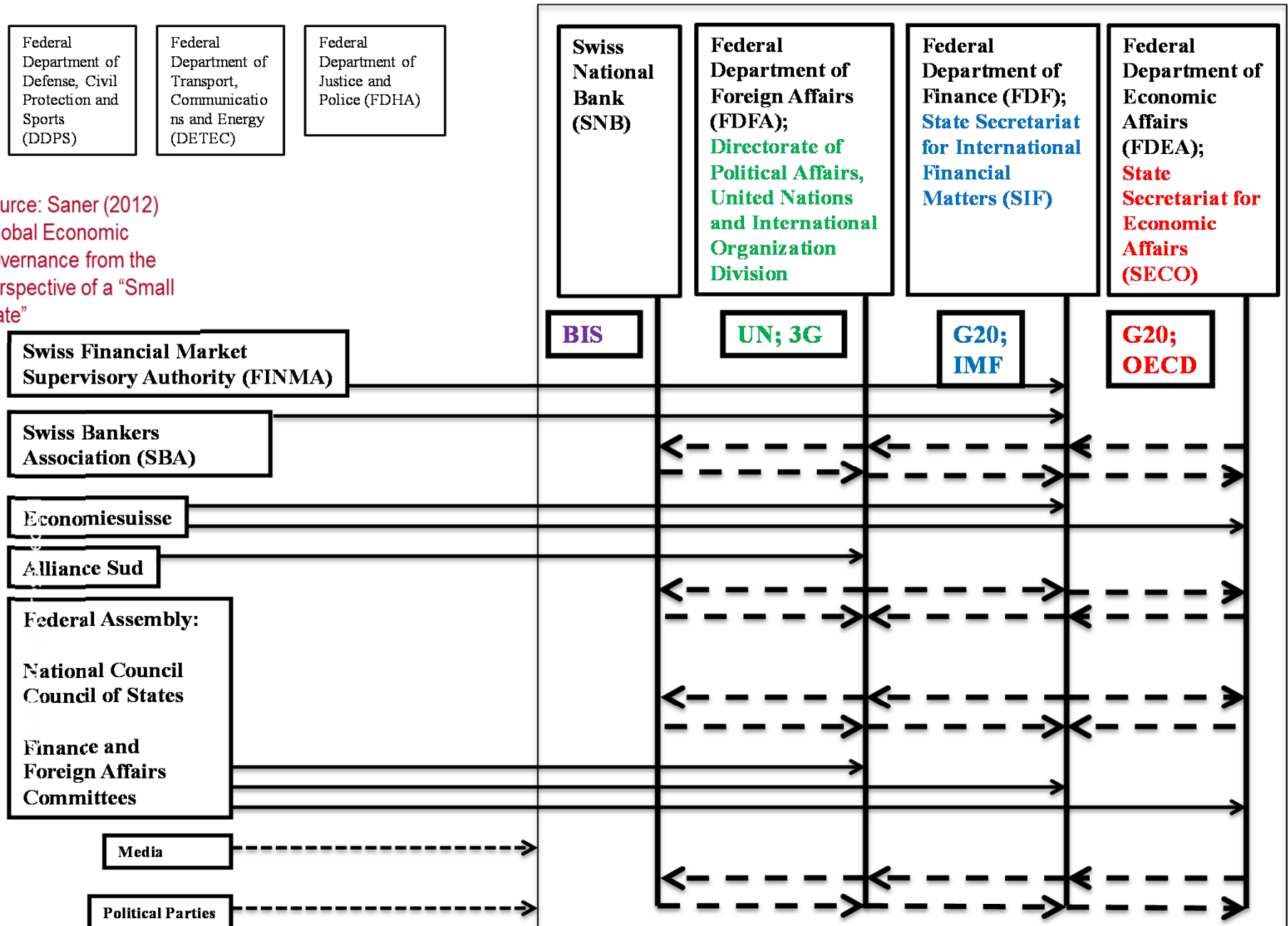

Shaping Switzerland's financial policy and economic diplomacy

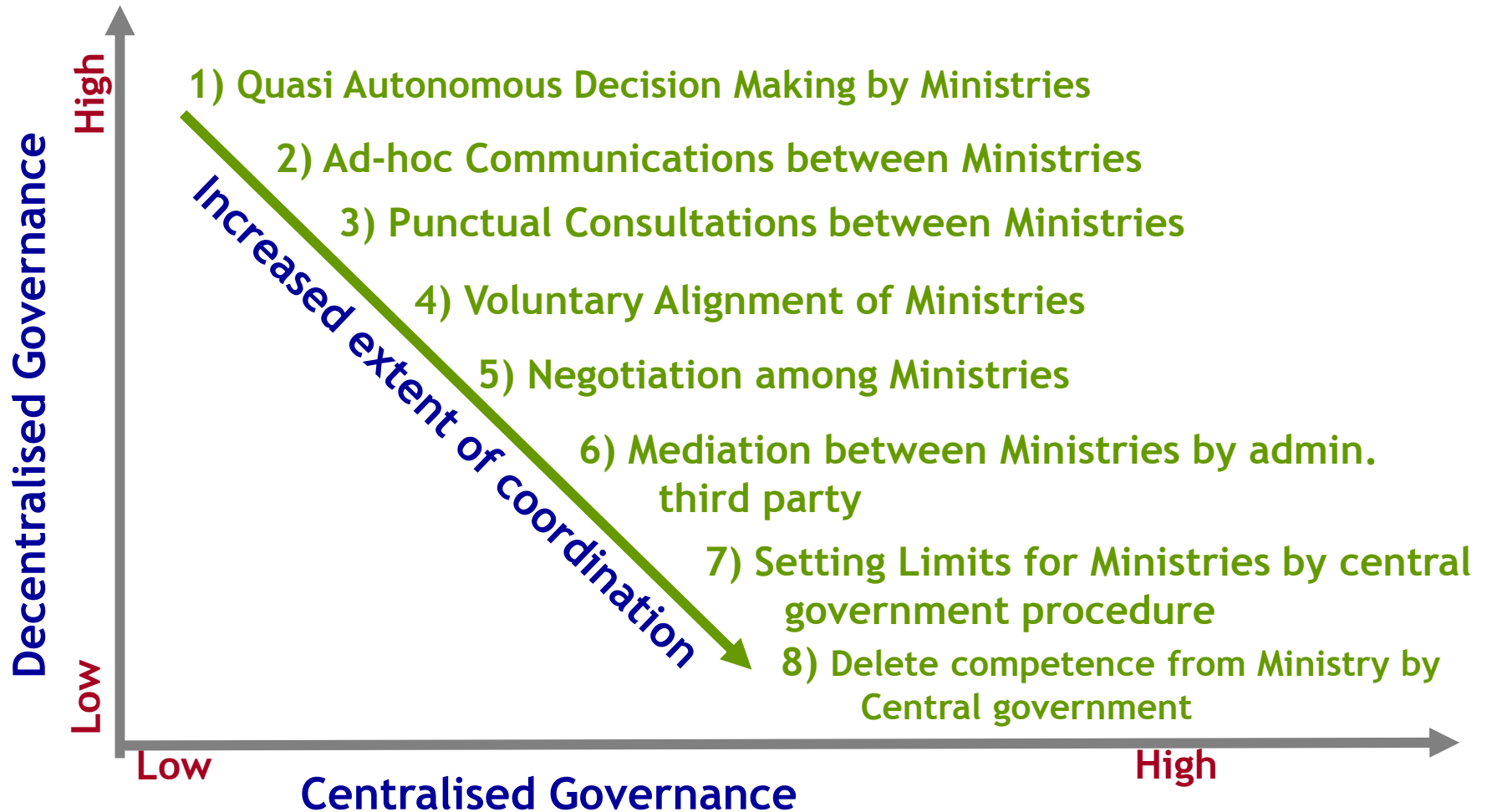

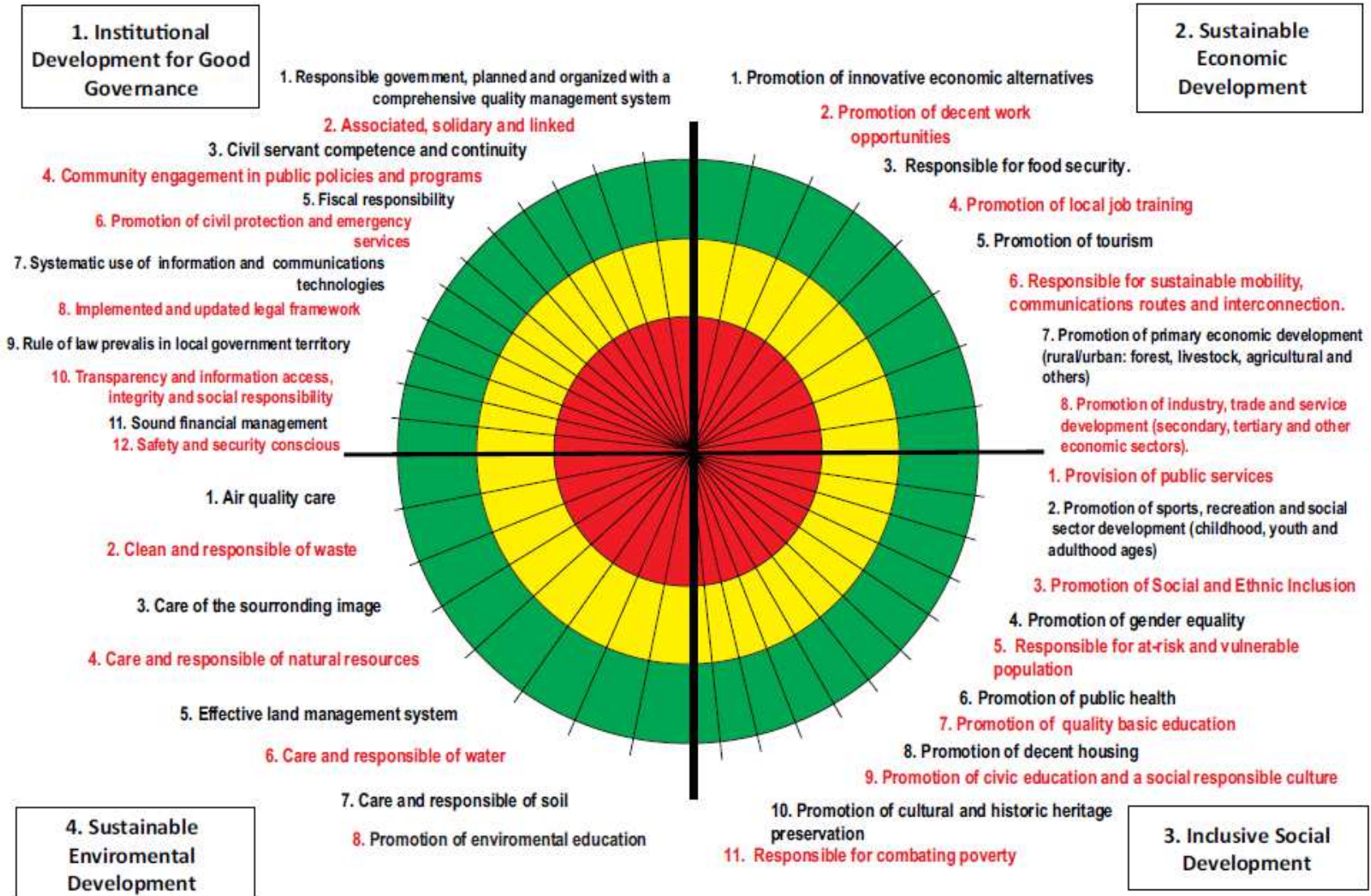


Levels of Governmental Coordination

Ensure sustainable SDGs!!



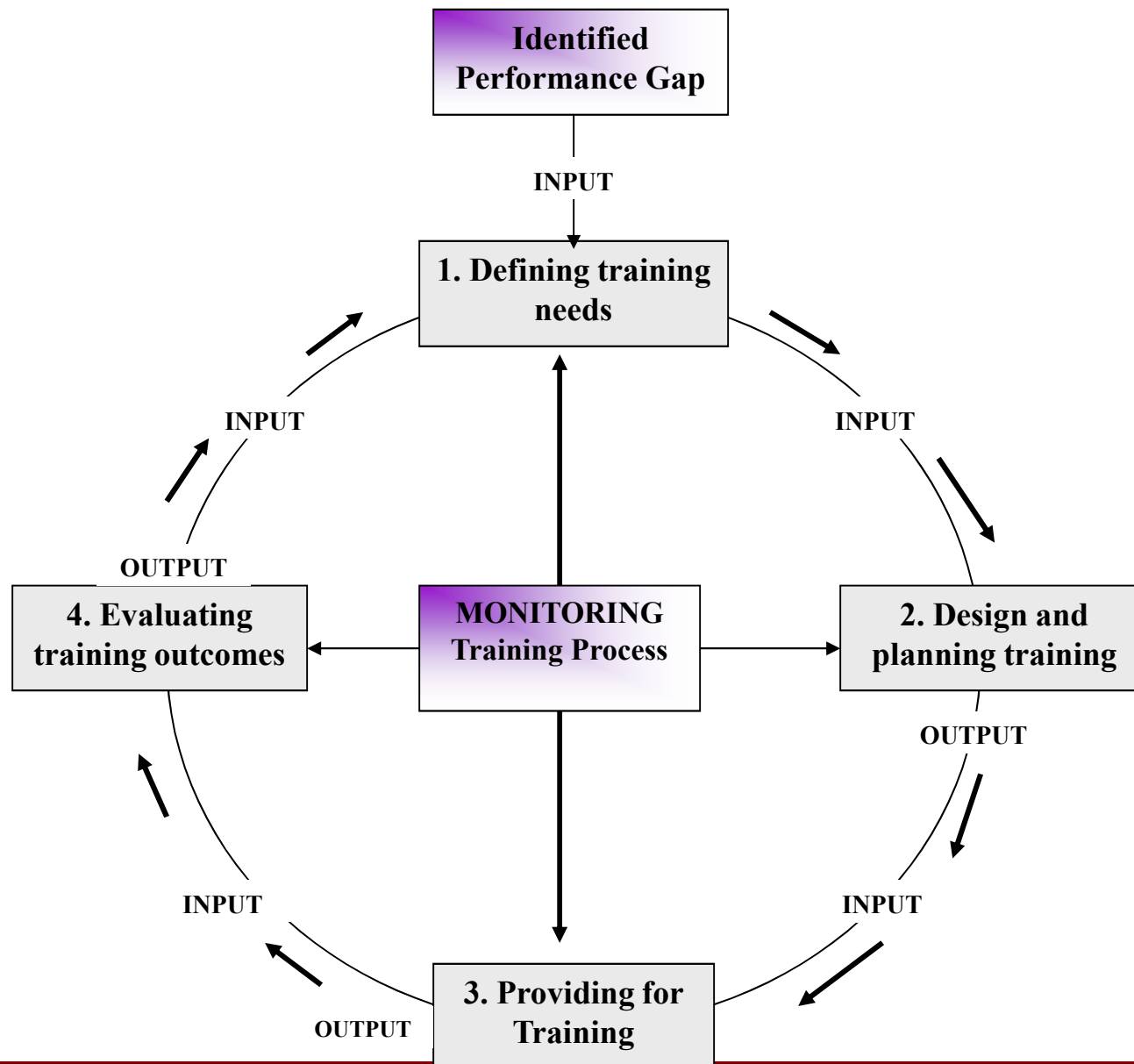
1. Over the next 13 years to 2030, most of our governments will have changed one or several times!!!!
2. Successor governments might not feel equally committed to SDGs as their predecessor government who negotiated and signed the SDGs in 2015
3. **Sustainable SDGs= continuity = requires administrative systems that outlive governments and continuous training (capacity building) for the next generations of SDG governments**

3. Capacity building (training)

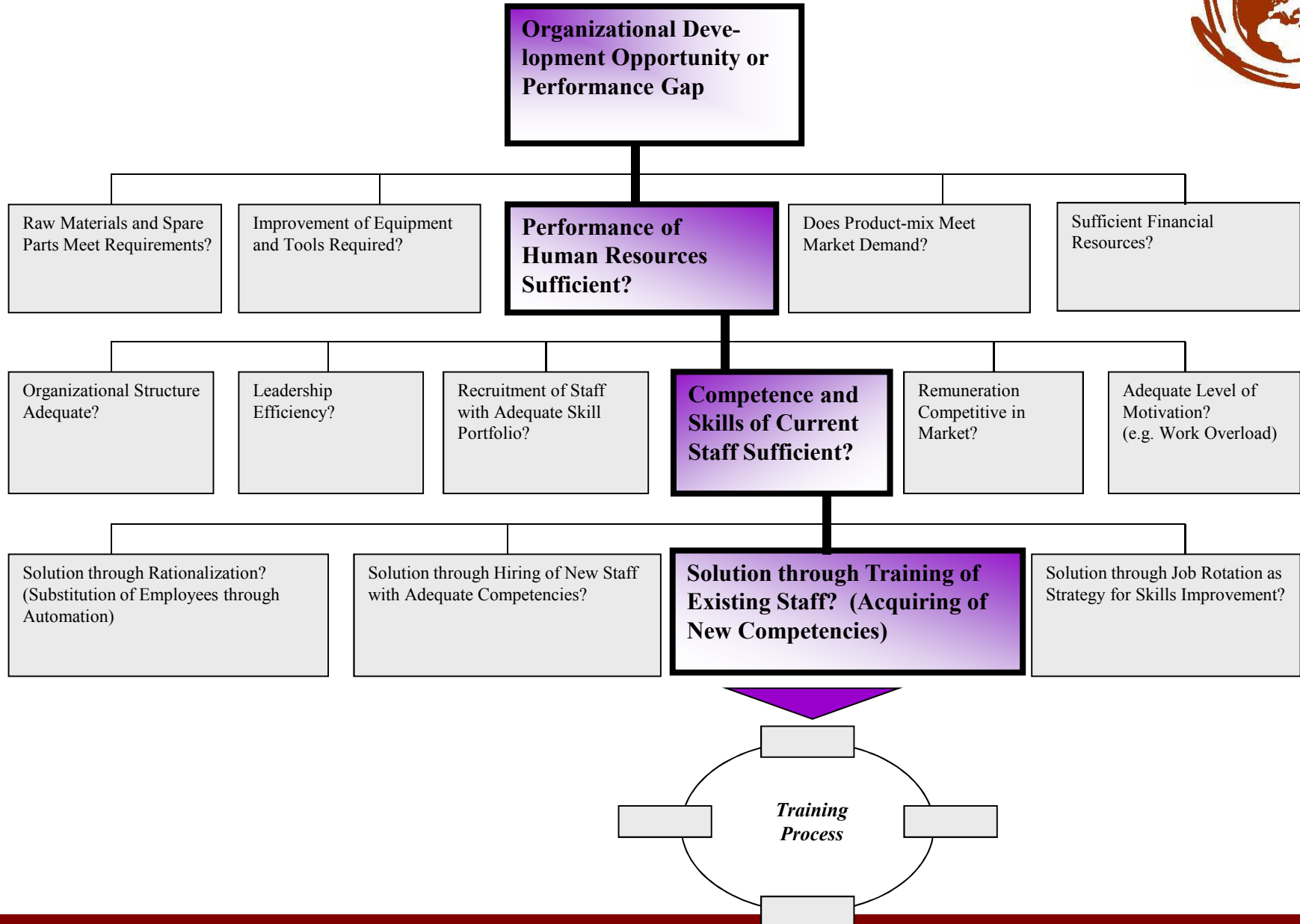


Levels
1. Reaction, Satisfaction, and Planned Action (learning contract with superior)
2. Learning (pre/ & post), testing knowledge & skills
3. Application and Implementation at Work
4. Admin Efficiency Impact of training
5. Admin. Effectiveness of Training Investment
