Learning objective

By completing this training module, participants will learn about:

- The methodology to assess the eight dimensions of an OGD ecosystem
- The initial findings of the assessment for a selected country
- Recommendations based on the initial findings from the assessment

Guiding Questions

By completing this module participants will be able to answer the following guiding questions:

- What are the main takeaways from the initial findings of the assessment for the selected country?
- How can the findings and recommendations be incorporated into the development of an OGD strategy and action plan?

Expected outputs

By attending this module, participants will be able to:

- Have a shared understanding of the opportunities and challenges that the local conditions create for an OGD programme in the selected country
- Discuss about the recommendations that can be drawn from the initial findings in the selected country

Methodology

This module will be conducted by an expert on OGD for sustainable development. The presentation will be followed by a Q&A session moderated by a dedicated facilitator.
